
Genealogy Corner

How I found the Nyberg Family

ne of my major genealogy discoveries came as a result of a visit to cousins in Michigan. Because of my interest in genealogy, one cousin gave me a couple old photo albums that belonged to my mother's parents. Most of the photos weren't identified and I didn't recognize anyone, but I decided to make copies and send them around to all my relatives, hoping that they would know someone.

At the same time that I received the albums, another cousin showed me an old letter that was sent to her mother in 1910 from Polson, Montana. Parts of the letter were missing, but it started out "Dear Cousin," and went on to mention the deaths of Esther and Harry, and the letter was signed "Bertha." None of us remembered our parents talking about a Cousin Bertha who lived in Montana. And I could not find anything in my genealogy files pertaining to this family.

I wrote letters and sent copies of the photos to every relative, and they were able to identify a few photos. But no one could recall a family with Bertha, Esther, and Harry in it. Among the pho-



tos was one of two young girls with the words "Esther and Adelia" on the back. And there was a funeral remembrance card for a Harry Nyberg who died in 1910. I began to wonder if there could be a connection between the letter and the photos, so acting on a hunch I went to the library and got addresses of newspapers in the Polson area; then I wrote to each of them asking if there was any record of a Harry Nyberg dying in January 1910.

There was no response from any of them and I was at a loss as to what to try next. I went back to the library and happened to see a file of genealogy material in the reference room. When I went through it, I saw the address of a genealogy society in Kalispell which is an hour from Polson. I wrote to them, explaining what I had done and asked if they could suggest something else. In less than two weeks, I had an envelope from them containing copies of the death certificate for Harry Nyberg and the name and address of Pearl Nyberg which they copied from the Polson phone book. And they had gone to the cemetery and copied down the Nyberg names from tombstones!

Needless to say, I was delighted and sent them a thank you note along with a contribution. My next step was to write to Pearl Nyberg and ask if any of the names were familiar. She replied that Harry was her nephew who had drowned in January 1910; Esther was his sister who had also died in 1910: Adelia was Esther's sister; and Bertha was their oldest sister. They were all dead except Adelia who was in ill health in Reno. Pearl suggested that I write to Adelia's daughter Betty who lived in Great Falls because she had no idea how we could be related.

I wrote Betty and she answered by saying she was puzzled, too. So I sent copies of the photos, especially those taken in Erie, Pennsylvania, and

California and Michigan after Betty mentioned that her grandparents had lived in Pennsylvania and Michigan, and a couple of their children had gone to California. Betty confirmed that the photos were part of her family, but we still didn't know how we were related. She then sent me a copy of her grandmother's pass-

port from Finland and when I saw the name I remembered seeing a similar name in my mother's father's family. A check revealed that Maja Sofia Matts-dotter Porko was the niece of my maternal grandfather and the daughter of his oldest sister.

Once the identity was confirmed, other facts

emerged. Maja had left Finland to live with an aunt and uncle in

AuSable, Michigan. They happened to be my maternal grandparents. Maja's daughter Bertha kept in touch with her cousin Alice in AuSable after she moved to Polson. But after she married, they evidently stopped writing and there was no further communication between the two families. No one knows why.



There's no one still living who would know, but it was exciting to discover new relatives. Betty supplied me with information on the entire family and we keep in touch. I was invited to visit her in Montana in 1986 and was able to meet some of the family. When I visited Finland, I made it a point to look up their rela-

tives in Rödsö. They were so happy to hear about their relatives in America and gave me some snapshots and gifts to take back to them. Such a happy ending to my genealogy problem. I'm glad I pursued it to the end.

English words infiltrate Finnish language

If you're an English speaker new to the Finnish language you may have wondered why some words seem so familiar, while others seem so utterly foreign. You're not losing your mind. Those comforting sounding terms may just be English-language loan words incorporated into Finnish by popular usage.

Bloggaaja, deitti, downshiftaus, hybridiauto, netti, nude, pimpata, spoilata, trolli, video, videoblogi, hipster. There's a reason why some of these words may seem comfortingly recognizable to English speakers. It's because they've been first borrowed, then firmly established in the Finnish language by popular usage.

According to Tarja Heinonen, a lexicographer with the Institute for Languages in Finland, Kotus, the number of English-language loan words making their way into Finnish conversations is growing every year.

"I would say that most words that have been recently adopted have been related to computer and Internet. Like 'spammata' to spam, 'googlata' or 'googlettaa' to google, print and scan are in Finnish 'printata' and skannata'," Heinonen told YLE News.

Proposals for Change for Discussion at the 2014 IOR Convention

1. Be it resolved that the International Order of Runeberg be dissolved.

Pro: The dissolution resolve is due to extreme shrinking membership, cost of Conventions, and the decline in activities that a Supreme Board is required to do.

Con: Continuation of the Order in its current form would be possible with the restructuring of the organization and changes to the Constitution and Bylaws allowing the Order of Runeberg to continue.

2. Be it resolved that International Conventions be discontinued due to shrinking membership and extensive cost of conventions.

Pro: and **Con:** Remains the same as for Resolution number 1.

3. Be it resolved that after December 2014, no more monies in the form of dues be forwarded to the Supreme Board Treasury by local lodges.

Pro: The discontinuance of dues would enable all remaining Lodges to keep their dues collected within their own treasury for local use. It would also decrease the total amount of money needed to be re-directed should the Order of Runeberg be dissolved.

Con: The dues collected would continue to support the Order of Runeberg for the purposes for which it currently uses said funds.

4. Be it resolved that should the Supreme Board be discontinued, the remaining lodges may continue to operate under the name of the Order of Runeberg.

Pro: A resolve to determine the legality of using the name Order of Runeberg by individual groups that wish to retain the name status.

Con: Without this necessary resolve, remaining lodges wishing to continue independently would possibly have to change their name, possibly contrary to the wishes of the majority.

5. Be it resolved that should the Supreme Board be eliminated, the *Leading Star* will continue to publish until all International Order of Runeberg business is completed.

Pro: The *Leading Star* is the main source of communication between all remaining members.

Con: Without this resolve, the *Leading Star* could be abolished before any finalization of the Order of Runeberg would be complete.

6. Be it resolved that should the Supreme Board be disbanded, a designated portion of the remaining funds be sent to the existing lodges to use for their local scholarship fund, charity, or lodge use. The amount should be established by a committee and then presented to the membership for final decision making.

Pro: This resolve would allow for pre-planning of the designation of funds that are held in the Supreme Board treasury.

Con: Without a resolve to pre-plan the designation of funds, hasty decisions could lead to detrimental results.

7. Be it resolved that in the event that the International Order of Runeberg disbands, all money remaining after bills, disbursements, and such related money matters are complete, that the residue of the Treasury be sent to the Swedish-Finn Historical Society, the legal repository for all documents pertaining to the Order of Runeberg.

Pro: The Swedish Finn Historical Society is the organization that has been the repository for all lodge documents. They have been responsible for archiving Order of Runeberg materials for many years.

Con: Spreading any remaining funds to several other organizations would be for goodwill purposes.
